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## **PUBLIC SPEAKING SPEECH - Stage 1**

Dear parents and carers

Over the next few weeks your child will need to plan, write and practise a speech on one of the following topics:

- Reading is important!

- Student choice (any topic your child chooses)

The speech needs to be up to **2 minutes** for competition **OR 1:30 min** for a non-competitive class speech and will be presented in class in **Week 5 Term 3, commencing Monday 15 August 2022**.

All speeches need to include at least three parts: introduction, body and conclusion. The following presentation outline is one of the ways for your child to organise the material into a speech format.
