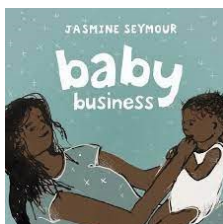

Go outside and collect natural resources (leaves, sticks, flowers) and create a piece of art using them.



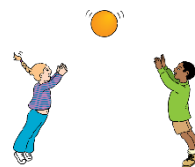
Take a photo of your picture and upload it to your portfolio on ClassDojo.

Play Dough Recipe

2 cups of plain flour

4 tbs of Cream of Tartar

2 tbs of oil 1 cup of salt

Food colouring

2 cups of boiling water



Mix all the ingredients except the water in a mixing bowl. Add the boiling water and stir as it congeals. If it is a bit sticky just flour the table or board before using and mix it in. As soon as the mixture cools enough the children can work with the warm dough.

Make the dough with your child. Measure the ingredients. Talk about the different ingredients being dry, wet, use words like liquid or solid. Talk about temperature as it cools.

If you don't have colouring then just make white dough. You can also add a few drops of essential oil to make it smell nice.
