#### Delivery of children to and collecting children from Education and Care Service Premises: -

- 1. On arrival at the school gate, press the buzzer and let the office staff know that you are delivering/collecting your preschool child.
  - If arrival is prior to 9:10am parents/carers will be allowed to come on site, however, they are asked to walk directly to the preschool area, wait outside and practise social-distancing. Parents/carers are encouraged to bring their child after the 9:10 bell (to avoid waiting outside) and we ask that all preschool children are at school by 9:30am at the latest to ensure learning is not missed.
- 2. When the 9:10am bell rings parents/carers use the second gate (to the right of the main preschool entrance). There will be a sign directing you to the gate to enter the preschool playground.
- 3. The attendance register will be set up outside the classroom at the bottom of the ramp where there will be sanitiser available. There is sanitiser available for parent/carer use before and after they sign in/out. Children wash their hands when they enter the preschool. If it's raining this table will be set up on the veranda.
- 4. In the morning, once the child is signed in, a staff member will be there to take them inside the preschool building.
- 5. In the afternoon, once the child is signed out, a staff member will bring your child to you.

**NOTE**: In the case of a new family joining the preschool and wanting to see the inside space or if a child is unsettled and needs their parent, those adults will be able to enter the preschool. They will be asked to sanitise and wear a mask. There will be a school supply of masks in the preschool. Social distancing recommendations will apply. This is dependent on the restrictions and health advice at the time of enrolment.

#### Dealing with Infectious Diseases (COVID-19): -

- In accordance with advice from NSW Health, parents and carers are reminded NOT to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms, for example cough, sore throat, runny nose, shortness of breath.
- If a child shows any of the above symptoms the child is kept separated from the other children with an adult and the parents/carers are contacted to collect their child as soon as possible.
- Parents/carers encouraged to take their child to the doctor and follow advice given as requested by NSW Health.

- Prior to returning to the service:
  - the parent/carer must provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result OR a clearance letter from the doctor
  - the child must be symptom free.
- In the event that a child or parent/carer has tested positive, all steps as directed by NSW Health will be followed. All departmental protocol will be put in place, including notifying the community/staff and deep cleaning, with the support of the director. Early Learning

## Hygiene Measures: -

- Clean hands for 20 seconds with soap and water or an alcohol-based hand sanitiser.
- Sneeze or cough into your elbow or a tissue. Used tissues to be placed straight into a bin and was hands immediately as above.
- Avoid touching eyes, nose and/or mouth.
- Don't share food or drink.
- Cleaner cleans common and high frequency areas three times during each day.
- Toys are washed more frequently.

## Changes to delivery of learning: -

- Singing only if in a straight line or in a circle facing out.
- Cooking educator washes hands and wears gloves; educator models while children watch; children given individual serves.
- More time spent outside, weather permitting.
- Intentional teaching of hygiene practices and COVID-19 using social stories.

#### Remote learning: -

- Learning will occur through ClassDojo.
- Teachers will post an overview of the week on the first day of each group. The children are given activities to choose from, including literacy, numeracy and movement.
- Educators post daily on ClassStory to keep in touch with families, upload videos and respond to question.
- Parents/carers are encouraged to upload photos/videos in their child's Portfolio to share learning at home with the educators.
- Educators provide feedback to the children regarding uploaded work.
- The LWPS website has an additional, extensive range of activities/websites which can be used at home.
- Where a family has Internet limitations, Take-Home Packs are made available.
- If there is no contact with a family through ClassDojo, an educator will do a wellbeing check via phone.

	Doors/windows are kept open as much as possible, weather permitting, to increase ventilation.
	Parents/carers are kept informed through ClassDojo SchoolStory and ClassStory.
